Who knew caterpillars could keep a crowd so entranced!

Our November 7th speaker was Pamm Cooper of the University of Connecticut Home and Garden Education Center. Pamm provided an appreciative crowd, information on caterpillars, the host plants they need, and the plants they use for nectar sources to become butterflies. Her power point presentation was filled with her detailed and current discoveries of caterpillars and butterflies in the Connecticut landscape. She also mentioned several parks, gardens and areas that we can do more of our own observation.

Pamm teaches the entomology portion of the UConn Master Gardener program and has studied native butterflies and raised their caterpillars since her youth.

Plants for Feeding Birds

Garden Plants with Seeds that Birds Love By Marie Iannotti

Birds bring beauty and sound to a garden. It's nice to put out bird feeders with seed and suet to attract birds to your yard and garden. But birds still like to forage and find their own food and it's especially important to have food for them to find, when the feeders are

empty. There are many wonderful trees and shrubs with fruits and berries in the fall and winter months. Less often talked about are the common garden flowers with seeds that most birds seem to gobble up. Let the last blooms stay on these plants throughout the winter and wait until spring to cut them back. Along with nourishment, many provide shelter and nesting material, too.
